





- √ Food contact material regulations are published by the Brazilian Health Regulatory Agency (ANVISA) which belongs to the Ministry of Health
- MERCOSUR'S Common Market Group (GMC) Resolutions are incorporated by ANVISA in the form of Ordinances and Resolutions
- The GMC Resolutions are published by ANVISA according to the type of material (plastic, glass, cellulose, elastomers, regenerated cellulose, waxes) and the identification numbers of the corresponding regulations are different

For instance, the GMC resolution on General criteria and material classification, which is GMC N. 03/92, was published by ANVISA as Resolution RDC N. 91 from May 11, 2001

MERCOSUR's efforts to amend the Additives Resolution, GMC Res. No. 32/07 (Brazil - Resolution N. 17/2008)

Brazil: Public Consultation N° 599 was published on January 22, 2019 concerning the positive list of additives and the closing meeting is scheduled to June 14, 2019.

MERCOSUR's efforts to amend the Additives Resolution, GMC Res. No. 32/07

The update also includes the following requeriments:

- → Specific migration limits (group restrition): Al (1mg/kg); Ba (1 mg/kg); Co (0,05 mg/kg), Cu (5 mg/kg), Fe (48 mg/kg), Li (0,6 mg/kg); Mn (0,6 mg/kg); Ni (0,02 mg/kg); Zn (5 mg/kg).
- Primary Aromatic Amines (PAAs): not detected (detection limit= 0,01mg/kg)
- Fat consumption reduction factor (FRF): lipophilic substance according to Table 1
- Tetermination of the specific migration by approximation

3.2. Polymeric Coatings
They can only be prepared with the substances included on the positive lists of polymers and additives for plastic materials in contact with foods and comply with restrictions of use, limits of composition and specific migrations established in the

Resolution GMC 46/06 – Metallic materials

2.1. The adhesives can only be prepared with one or more substances mentioned on the "Positive List of Polymers and Resins for Plastic Packaging and Equipment in contact with Food", on the "Positive List of Additives for Plastic Materials and Equipment in contact with Food" and the "Positive List for Cellulosic Materials and Equipment in contact with Food" and on the "Positive List for Tellastomeric Materials and Equipment in contact with Food" and on the "Positive List for Elastomeric Materials and Equipment in contact with Foods", approved in corresponding legislation.

Legislation updates

Brazil procedures to request the inclusion of substances in the positive lists or the development of a new regulation (new technologies) or a regulation update

- √A formal request (a petition) must be made to ANVISA by companies or industry associations
- ✓It must be addressed to ANVISA
- √The petitioner must have an office or a representative office in Brazil

if there is no harmonized regulation in MERCOSUR, ANVISA will evaluate the request and may include the subject in its Regulatory Agenda in accordance with the priority established by ANVISA

if there is a harmonized regulation in MERCOSUR, it should follow the MERCOSUR procedures

Good Manufacturing Practices (GMP)

Good Manufacturing Practices for manufacturers of packaging and equipment intended to come into contact with food

√ The requirements are similar to those described in the standards used for certification (mainly PAS 223:2011 and BRC IoP)

Registration and Imported products

√Resolution N. 23 of March 15, 2000

Guide on basic procedures for registration and exemption from registration of products related to food

√Resolution N. 22 of March 15, 2000

Technical Regulation on procedures for registration and exemption from registration of imported products related to food

√Resolution RDC N. 27 of August 06, 2010

This regulation updates food and packaging exempted from registration and those with mandatory registration

Resolutions N. 22/2000, N. 23/2000 and RDC N. 27/2010

Main Points

✓ Packaging and materials for food contact are exempted from mandatory registration (except those made of recycled materials)

The recycled materials have mandatory registration
In Brazil, only these materials are allowed: PCR-PET and Cellulosic

Resolution N. 22 and N. 23 of March 15th. 2000

Packaging and materials for food contact are exempted from obligatory registration (except for recycled packages)



However:

- Packaging and food industries must comply with the published technical regulations
- Sanitary Inspection is required (Operation License)
- Good Manufacture Practices must be implemented in compliance with legislation
- HACCP must be implemented
- Companies must inform the beginning of the manufacture of the product to the Sanitary Authority

Exporting to Brazil

The same steps, procedures and technical requirements for the packages produced nationally must be observed by the local representative in Brazil and/or importer.

- Sanitary or Operation License of the warehouse
- The importation of products must be informed to the Authority thought a specific form
- Good manufacturing / storage products must be implemented
- ${\color{blue} \bullet}$ Compliance with the Brazilian technical regulations in force

MERCOSUR and Brazil have no specific regulation for these topics

✓ Nanomaterials: it is recommended to send specific petitions to ANVISA

Other Issues

- ✓ Printing inks: it is recommended to follow the requirements of Swiss Legislation or EUPIA guide
- ✓ Active and Intelligent packaging
- *Biopolymers (PLA, PHB...)
- \checkmark They should be in compliance with plastic regulations for food contact materials
- They should be listed on the Positive Lists (Resolution RDC N. 56/2012 and Resolution RDC N. 17/2008)
